## Residential Savings Due to Price to Beat Reduction

- Through July 2002, residential customers paid approximately \$563 million less under the price to beat rates as compared to the rates in effect on December 31, 2001.
  - \$160 million from statutorily mandated 6% reduction.
  - \$403 million from reduced fuel costs and the expiration of fuel surcharges.
- At <u>current</u> price to beat rates, customers would save an additional \$484 million when compared to 12/31/01 rates from August through December of 2002.
  - \$141 million from statutorily mandated 6% reduction.
  - \$343 million from reduced fuel costs and the expiration of fuel surcharges.
- Potential savings available if <u>all</u> residential customers switched to lowest cost offer in their area.
  - \$277 million on an annual basis
  - \$164 million from August through December



## Comparison of July Bills for Household Using 1000 kWh per Month - TXU








## Comparison of July Bills for Household Using 1000 kWh per Month - Reliant








#### Comparison of July Bills for Household Using 1000 kWh per Month - TNMP








## Comparison of July Bills for Household Using 1000 kWh per Month – CPL








#### Comparison of July Bills for Household Using 1000 kWh per Month - WTU




#### Transfers to POLR

- As of Monday July 22, 2002:
  - 42,387 transfers to POLR have been completed on a cumulative basis
    - This number includes transfers back to the bundled utility during the pilot.
    - This number reflects all cumulative requests to transfer to POLR and may include some customers who have subsequently selected a REP other than the POLR.
  - 19,502 transfers to POLR are scheduled.
  - 7,960 transfers to POLR are in review.

#### SBF and Low-Income Discounts

- Approximately 528,000 customers received the discount in June
- Based on the reports submitted by REPs for June, approximately \$6.5 million in discounts were given to low income customers in June 2002.
  - includes "catching up" some customers who did not get discount in previous months
  - Includes increased discount of 17% from 10% in previous months
- Approximately \$18 million in discounts given to low income customers year-to-date.
